### The Jungle Ultra

Running a marathon isn't easy, but ultra races are considerably more difficult than typical marathons. In ultra races, people run in weather cold temperatures. They sometimes include challenging locations like high mountains or icy lakes. Athletes mustn't participate in these races without properly preparing for them.

One of the most difficult ultra races is the Jungle Ultra. The Jungle Ultra is an extreme 230-kilometre, five-day running event in the Amazon. Athletes start the race at Cloud Forest in Peru. Athletes must adapt to the high elevation of about 3,650 metres. On the first day of the race, they run 38 kilometres, but they go downhill, so this should be easy for them.

During the Jungle Ultra, participants run in temperatures of 40°C. There is often heavy rain, so the ground can be wet. In some places, it's very dark and it's difficult to see the dangerous animals, such as snakes and spiders, around them. Worst of all, athletes must cross 70 rivers along the route. Man-eating reptiles live in some of these rivers, so the journey across is very dangerous.

Participants must maintain their energy during the race. They should eat well, but they can't carry large quantities of food. What do the runners eat during the race? Bananas and apples can give the runners energy, but fresh fruit is heavy to carry. Dried fruit, rice and meat like ham is easier to carry. Energy bars are also a good idea. The runners must carry a bottle of water and they can get more water in several places. They should drink often. Athletes also need rest. When they arrive at one of the camps at night, they can change into a dry T-shirt and shorts and sleep for several hours.

People in the disaster areas haven't got clean drinking water, so the company is sending them more than 155,000 cans of water. **MATTRESS MACK OPENS HIS DOORS:** Many people lost their homes in the hurricane and didn't have places to sleep. Jim "Mattress Mack" McIngvale sells furniture in Houston, Texas. He has got two large furniture shops and he opened the doors to these shops and invited victims to come to his shops to sleep. More than 750 people were sleeping on chairs, sofas, beds and mattresses in these shops after the hurricane.

**GENEROUS FAMILY FEEDS RESCUE WORKERS:** Rescue teams and volunteers were working hard to save people from the floods. Weak and hungry from hours of work, they needed food to continue. There weren't any restaurants or shops open, so Matthew Otero decided to open his doughnut shop to help them. There wasn't any electricity, so Otero used an electric generator. He and his family were working day and night to make coffee and doughnuts for the rescue teams and other people in the area.

**BRAVE PEOPLE SAVE LIVES:** Today, many brave citizens arrived with boats to pull people out of the water. CNN reporter Ed Lavandera was also travelling on a boat in the floods. During his news report, a woman called to him and asked for help to rescue her parents. He immediately stopped reporting and helped to pull the family into his boat.
